Find Your Passion

Create Goals

Bring it to life with action words that share 3 key goals: To....

Dig deeper. Write a goal- ask yourself why? If you can answer, go further to flesh out the goal some more. When you get to “just because”, get back to your vision, you’ve got a goal!



Make A Work Plan

Look at your notes from creating goals for ideas on tasks and activities. Write out a list of “to-do’s” for each goal, then group them into key tasks for each goal for a first draft of your workplan.

Goal: “Plan and facilitate a workshop””

Task example: “ Prepare for workshop”

Sub-task example: “Invite participants”

Activities example: “Develop invitations; make posters;”

- ❖ Waste Diversion School Presentations- prizes, games, information, poster challenge;
