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Success Indicators are used to measure the success of your project based on quantifiable (ie. # of people that attend an event) and qualitative (ie. Testimonials from youth and young adults) data.

Why do we measure the success of a project overall ?

- Provides tangible results that show the effectiveness of a project;
- Provides baseline data for the project and your community; and,
- Often used to show support for a project and/or initiative that could lead to further support (ie. Funding).





Seventh Generation Waste Warriors will measure the following indicators:


- # of youth that participated in the program;
- # of young adults that participated in the program;
- # of chaperones that participated in the program;
- # of Elders that participated in the program;
- # of Producer Responsibility Organization representatives that presented at the workshops;
- # of community clean up events conducted;
- # and types of community driven waste diversion actions conducted;
- # of waste warriors workshops completed;
- # and types of equipment purchased that supports waste diversion activities in communities;
- # of waste and recycling collection facilities toured; and,
- Feedback from youth and chaperones on the quality of the program (surveys)
